- ANDERSON: Um, our conversation was very cordial and, uh, it was, you know, just the standard, standard conversation you have with anybody. Um, you know, it was back and forth. I was asking her questions and she was answering and, uh, she didn't appear st- odd or any-, you know, nothing stood out to me that, you know, was different, you know. Her children were playing on the floor and, um, yeah, I mean everything seemed, seemed normal, you know, as far as her behavior and everything during the conversation, so.
- DAVISSON: Um, and forgive me, I have to cross some of these off.
- ANDERSON: Oh.
- DAVISSON: I know they've been...
- ANDERSON: Sorry.
- DAVISSON: You mentioned the knife came within a couple inches of you.
- ANDERSON: Mm-hmm.
