13 INCIDENT DESCRIPTION / NARRATIVE:

{On 12-02-2012 at approximately 1416 hours I was on routine patrol in the city of Seattle. I was in full uniform driving a fully marked patrol vehicle. I was working for the Police Department for the city of Seattle as unit 2 David 3. I responded to 734 Westlake Ave N, The World Sports Bar, for a dispatched call regarding a customer that had been waving a pool stick in the manager's face. I arrived on scene with Officer O'Cleary and contacted the complainant, C/ [REDACTED], [REDACTED] who was working as the manager of the World Sports Bar.

According to [REDACTED], the suspect, known only at the time as Katt Williams, had been involved in a dispute with another patron of the bar the night before and again on this date. [REDACTED] stated the suspect had just left the business prior to our arrival and had gone to a R.V. parked outside the business. I knocked on the door of the R.V. but received no answer. I returned into the business and contacted [REDACTED] a second time. [REDACTED] stated he wanted the suspect to be trespassed from the World Sports Bar. While contacting [REDACTED] an unidentified customer, who requested to remain unidentified, approached and stated the suspect had left through the 9 Ave N entrance. The unidentified male stated the suspect had approached a blue Ford sedan and had screamed at the female driver. He last saw the suspect at the intersection of 9 Ave N and Valley St. before conducting an area search for the suspect. [REDACTED] asked if we would be able to stick around in case the suspect came back. I informed him we would be on the call for some time and we would remain in the area.

Officer O'Cleary and I checked the restaurant on the corner of 9 Ave N and Valley St, Bucca de Beppo, for the suspect but our area check was negative. One of the employees at Bucca De Beppo asked if we were looking for Katt Williams and I stated yes. The employee stated Katt Williams was the comedian performing in the city.

As we exited the restaurant I observed a black male walking northbound in the 700 block of 9 Ave N on the east side of the street, matching the description. Officer O'Cleary and I walked over to the R.V. where I last saw the suspect. As I passed the glass windows on the north side of the bar I looked inside and saw the suspect inside the bar again. Officer O'Cleary and I entered the bar through the Westlake Ave N side entrance. I looked at [REDACTED] who was in the entrance and I asked him if that was the suspect. [REDACTED] confirmed.

I approached the suspect, later identified as A/WILLIAMS, MICHA S KATT, B/M/[REDACTED]-1971, and identified myself as Officer Virgilio and advised him I

was with the Seattle Police Department. I asked WILLIAMS if he was Katt Williams and he stated he was. I informed him that I had been advised he was involved in a few disturbances within the bar area and the manager requested Seattle Police to assist with trespassing him from the business. WILLIAMS stated "I suppose you're going to ask me to take my hands out of my pockets huh?" I stated that would be good if he did and advised him he needed to leave the property. I did not have a chance to obtain his information yet, but WILLIAMS immediately began walking for the door. I advised him to wait up. WILLIAMS walked briskly out the door and stood out front on the street. I caught up to WILLIAMS and I asked him if he had any Identification on him. WILLIAMS stated no he did not. I asked him if he spelled his first name with two "T's" and he stated "What do you think? KATT isn't my first name!" I asked him what his first name was to which he replied "You already know since you assumed it was KATT!" I asked him again if he was going to provide me with his name. WILLIAMS stated "No." but then yelled out a CA driver's license number. I advised him if he did not provide his information than he would be subject to arrest for obstruction. I asked him again if he would provide me with his name and again he stated "No." WILLIAMS then turned around and faced away from with my on his own accord and placed his hands behind his back. I placed WILLIAMS under arrest initially for obstruction. Two of WILLIAMS' associates were standing nearby and were pleading for WILLIAMS to calm down. Officer O'Cleary addressed his associates and maintained cover for me during my search incident to arrest.

I began searching WILLIAMS at the front end my patrol car. I advised him he was being audio and video recorded. I advised WILLIAMS of his Miranda Warnings twice, but each time he refused to acknowledge his warnings. WILLIAMS made several comments about how he was going to sue to department and me. He stated he had been arrested over 30 times in the last few months and every time he was released prior to being booked into jail. He made comments regarding my employment with the city of Seattle and how it would end as a result of his arrest. WILLIAMS stated he had millions of dollars and this arrest would not affect him.

I finished my search and I had located a passport with WILLIAMS' information in his rear left pant pocket. I asked him why he hadn't provided me with his passport when I requested ID. WILLIAMS stated "you asked for my driver's license. I didn't have it!" he went on to explain that when he was contacted in the past and provided his passport, other officers had told him it was not a valid form of ID.

I was now prepared to place WILLIAMS into the back of my patrol car. Due to his aggressive behavior and the fact that I was parked very close to active Westlake Ave N traffic I wanted to ensure I had good control over WILLIAMS. WILLIAMS became aggressive and resistant and his actions forced me to take

him to the ground for a short period of time. He was subsequently placed in the back of my patrol car.

I requested Officer O'Cleary to obtain a written statement from any witnesses and victims inside the bar. Officer O'Cleary requested a supervisor respond to the scene.

SGT Long responded. I screened the arrest with SGT Long on the scene in person. At the time I had WILLIAMS under arrest for obstruction. Officer O'Cleary obtained a statement from the manager, [REDACTED], who stated he had been threatened by WILLIAMS in the bar when he attempted to diffuse a situation between WILLIAMS and some other patrons.

According to [REDACTED], he was working as the manager of the World Sports Bar. One of [REDACTED]'s bartenders told him WILLIAMS had been acting aggressively towards other customers. He was told WILLIAMS was escalating his speech, using profanities and getting within inches of people's faces. A customer approached [REDACTED] and asked him to keep an eye on WILLIAMS because he was trying to pick fights with other customers. [REDACTED] stated, WILLIAMS at one point began playing pool and had some sort of interaction with another couple of customers. During the interaction an argument began and quickly escalated. [REDACTED] stated he walked over and attempted to separate the couple and WILLIAMS. [REDACTED] stated WILLIAMS began yelling at him for "protecting the customers from the famous guy!" [REDACTED] stated WILLIAMS then picked up a pool stick, raised it up and pointed it at his face. He continued to state if he hadn't stepped back the stick would have hit him in the face. [REDACTED] asked him to put the stick down. WILLIAMS asked "What if I don't?" and jabbed the stick towards him again. [REDACTED] then asked WILLIAMS to leave and he refused. Officer O'Cleary obtained a written statement from [REDACTED].

During the course of the investigation an additional victim called and reported she had been assaulted and threatened by WILLIAMS in the bar. The victim, identified as V/[REDACTED], [REDACTED], stated she had left with her fianc e in a hurry as she was afraid to stay in the bar at the time.

Officer Stewart responded to the residence and obtained a digital recorded statement from [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED].

WILLIAMS provided Officer Stewart with a digitally recorded statement regarding the events that transpired.

WILLIAMS was booked into KCJ for assault, harassment, and obstruction. I request additional charges be brought up for additional counts of harassment: When suspect WILLIAMS made a gun gesture with his hands towards the victim, Assault and property damage: When Suspect WILLIAMS threw a rock at the victim's vehicle window, Reckless Endangerment: The rock thrown by

suspect WILLIAMS struck the victim vehicle window which was directly next to an 8 year old girl. Had the glass shattered or the rock had penetrated the window it could have struck and harmed the 8 year old victim.
